Our congregational year too follows these seasonal rhythms here in the Northeast, as the past few months have brought greater opening and the flourishing of Spring to our community.

This abundance would not have been possible without so many contributing their gifts. Now, in this moment, we may be exhausted. We may yearn for a quieting or a replenishing of spirit. These warm days of summer invite us to rest. And so- at this moment- let's take time to celebrate the blessings of this past season and look ahead to center and refill the well this summer. Let us also take time to offer gratitude for gifts and people we must now let go of, as we prepare the way to welcome the new.

The blessings of the Spring were many: a successful pledge campaign; the welcoming of three new members - **Chaz Baldwin, Linda Berkhoff, and Katherine Molina-Powell** - in our April Easter service; the full return of coffee hours with delicious baked goods; meaningful worship led by myself and members of our own community; multigenerational rituals on RE and Flower Celebration Sundays; UU visitors from Southbury and Meriden; new connections and activities through the vibrant Social Souls network; and engagement with the larger community at events such as the Stamford Chorale concert held in our sacred space; and *Bark in the Park* where I blessed- and was blessed by - over 50 dogs. ## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION





## BUILDING A FOUNDATION FOR THE FUTURE

*For the past six months, a small task force has been exploring the possibility of establishing a separate 501(c)(3) Foundation to seek building preservation funds from entities that would not provide financial assistance to a religious organization, and to promote our space for broader community use.*

### *Foundation Mission Statement*

*To preserve and promote our Sanctuary Building, which is on the National Register of Historic Places, so that it may continue to serve as a space for community in the same tradition as it has for 152 years.*

*Since 1870, serving the arts – ideas - celebrations – and families.*

We have applied for complimentary legal services from *Pro Bono Partnership* to assist us in securing non-profit status for the Foundation. While this process has demonstrated the need for dedicated time and energy for this project, it remains essential that UU values be the basis upon which it is built, and that the Board and congregation be involved at each step.

With its history, its beauty, its size, and its central location, our sanctuary building is a unique gathering space for the greater Stamford community. Ultimately, it can lend financial support for UUC by relieving our operating and capital budgets of some of the constant strain of maintenance and upkeep.

As a foundation, we can apply for grants not generally available to religious organizations. We can also promote the building, making it more widely known beyond our corner lawn.

For broad community use it is recommended that the “hall” (the Sanctuary) be dedicated with its own name, by which the space can become known in the community.

Over the summer, we will seek input from the congregation on the naming of Hall. So far, suggestions have been *Emerson Hall*, *Latham Hall* and *Prospect Hall*. After July 4<sup>th</sup>, we will have a table in the Community Room, with greater explanations in support of each name, and ask you to vote for your choice. You may also submit your own suggestion, with supporting evidence! Stay tuned...
