

BUSINESS UPDATES

- The Annual Meeting was well-attended this June with congregants passing the budget and approving the slate of officers for the 23-24 year.
- The Board of Trustees presented the Annual Recognition Award to former Board
 VP Maria Lassman for her significant service in all areas of church life.
- The work of restoring our beautiful sanctuary is ongoing, with the missing upper window having been ordered and being shipped from abroad. Additionally, our driveway and parking area were paved and create an aesthetically pleasing and safe area now for all who enter!

OF NOTE - The Emerson Hall Foundation work is moving forward, including incorporation of the Foundation and securing a Federal ID number. We have approved By-Laws, are working on a website and letterhead, and researching D&O insurance options. In the coming months, we will be exploring historic preservation connections and grant options, marketing strategies and other ways to become more visible in the community!
